Booking Fall Field Trips Now!

Explore the John R. Park Homestead's Harvest Program for K-4 curriculum experiences that let you get hands-on with history!

- Gather wind-fall apples in the orchard followed by pressing and tasting apple cider (pasteurized cider is served for safety)
- Enjoy an old fashioned Corn Bee where students can try husking, shelling, and more
- Help with the Apple Bee as we peel, core, slice and hang apples to dry (food preservation); samples of dried apple available
- Visit the early settler garden to lend a hand wit this year's harvest
